Her Loving Journey

Nan Carol Wiley-Hendley was born on September 30, 1951 to the late Silas L. Wiley and Carristine Wiley in Houston, Texas. Nan was the oldest of three girls. She professed her faith in Christ at an early age and was baptized at Greater Zion Missionary Baptist Church under the leadership of the late Reverend M.L. Price. At an early age, Nan's musical talent was recognized by her parents and she along with her sister, Pat began studying piano at The Franklin School of Music.

Nan was a product of the Houston Independent School District - attending Whidby Elementary School, Attucks Middle School and Evan E. Worthing High School. While attending Worthing, Nan was a member of the Concert Choir and The Charmettes. Upon graduating from high school, Nan attended Prairie View A&M University and received an Associates Degree in Secretarial Science. Years later, she aspired to pursue a new career path and returned to her alma mater to study criminology. Through this experience, Nan earned a Bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice. Nan was often admired for being a lovely and beautiful young lady thus, The Ambassadors of Fort Worth, Texas had the honor in presenting her to society as a 1971 debutante at their Annual Debutante Ball.

On December 23, 1972, Nan married William Clyde Hendley and to this union one son, William Clyde Hendley II (Footsie) was born. Nan was quite adamant about her son's education. As a result, she was involved in various activities and in attendance at athletic events that William participated in. She was certainly his #1 fan and could be seen and heard screaming "S-T-I-N-K" as he entered Ratliff Stadium.

With a passion for interior and fashion design, Nan's remarkable eye was the driving force which inspired her to open "Pretty Feet Shoes & Accessories" in downtown Odessa, Texas. Nan was affiliated with several organizations in the city of Odessa, including the South Odessa People in Action Heritage Organization (SOPIA), The Boys and Girls Club, and The Black Chamber of Commerce, where she received the Ladies of Distinction award. While living in the city of Odessa, Nan was employed by Ector County and The Midland Sheriffs Department. Upon returning to Houston, she worked at Johnson and Johnson's Adult Center, where she thrived in giving care to others in need until her health began to fail her.

As a pillar in her community, Nan's strong faith in God led her to Carter Chapel C.M.E. Church where she served faithfully. To unite her family, Nan joined St. Matthews Baptist Church where she served diligently in numerous auxiliaries including Missionary Worker, Senior Choir Soloist and Sunday School Teacher.

Upon moving back to her hometown of Houston, Texas, Nan reunited with the Metropolitan C.M.E. Church. She was a faithful member of the Mass Choir, Stewardess Board and Sunday School. Nan served as the local and district President of the Stewardess Board and Vice President of the Annual Conference Stewardess Board. Nan was also proud to have served as a delegate to the Annual Conference under the leadership of Reverend Allen Page III.

She is preceded in death by her father, Silas L. Wiley; and sister, Patricia Wiley-Crumbo. **She leaves to cherish her memory to** her son, William C. Hendley II; granddaughter, Xyonna; mother, Carristine Wiley; sister, Kimberly Wiley-Jules (Benjamin); one nephew, Silas L.
